



Coachella Valley Volunteers in Medicine 2025 Community Impact Report



Coachella Valley Volunteers in Medicine (CVVIM) provides free healthcare services to qualifying adults from its clinics in Palm Springs and Indio thanks to volunteer medical professionals who donate their time to those who are uninsured or who do not have the financial means to access care.

This overview summarizes CVVIM's 2025 highlights and the positive impact the nonprofit had on the community.

A Snapshot of Who We Serve

At Coachella Valley Volunteers in Medicine, patients represent a diverse cross-section of the working community. While many are actively employed, a significant portion are navigating unemployment or transitional life circumstances – indicating the critical role of accessible, no-cost healthcare.

Key Insights

Majority Employed (59%)

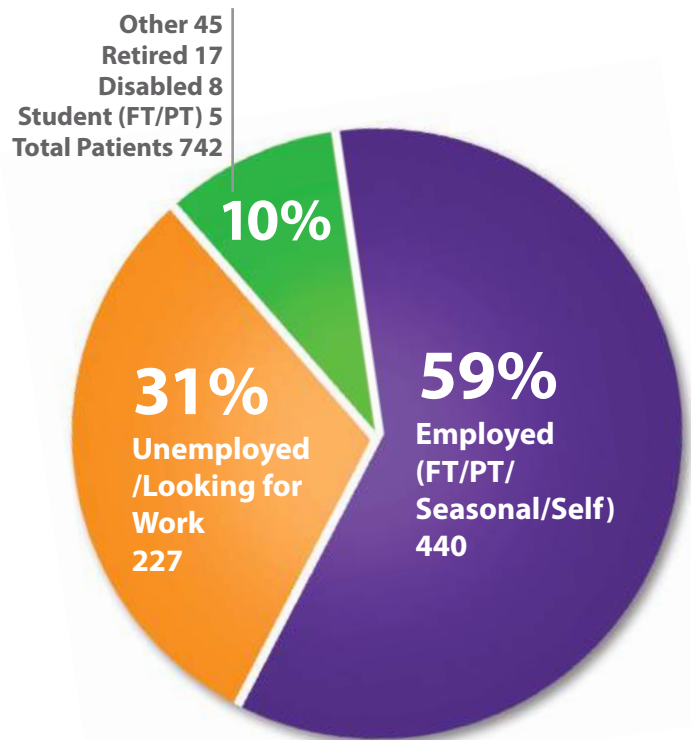
Most patients are working individuals –including seasonal, part-time, and self-employed – who lack access to employer-sponsored healthcare.

Nearly One-Third Unemployed (31%)

A substantial segment is actively seeking employment, underscoring the importance of a healthcare safety net during periods of instability.

Small but Vulnerable Populations (10%)

Individuals who are retired, disabled, or students represent a smaller share but often require consistent and ongoing care.



Why This Matters

Access to healthcare remains a challenge – even for those with jobs. Many of CVVIM's patients are part of the working uninsured, balancing employment with limited financial resources and no health coverage. CVVIM bridges this gap by providing comprehensive, no-cost medical services, ensuring that employment status does not determine access to care.

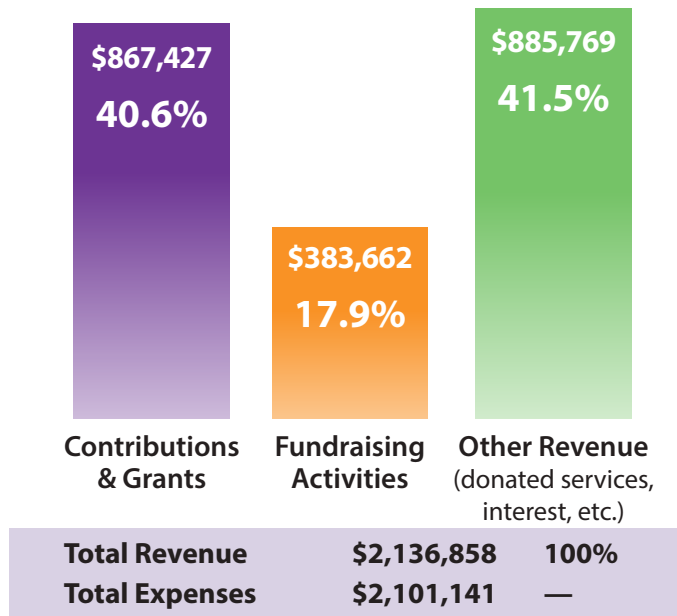
Volunteers

In 2025, more than 200 dedicated volunteers were at the heart of CVVIM's mission – contributing their time, expertise and compassion to ensure patients receive high-quality, no-cost care. Based on comparable wages across the Inland Empire, the value of these volunteer services totaled \$593,692 – representing an extraordinary investment in community health.

Volunteers not only expand access to care and strengthen clinical capacity, but also play a vital role in shaping the next generation of healthcare professionals. Through partnerships with educational institutions such as CSUSB (Palm Desert), UCR (Palm Desert), and graduate medical programs at Desert Care Network and Eisenhower Health, CVVIM provides hands-on learning opportunities that prepare future healthcare workers and leaders.

Together, these contributions ensure that CVVIM delivers compassionate care today while helping build a stronger healthcare workforce for tomorrow.

Revenue & Total Expenses Summary



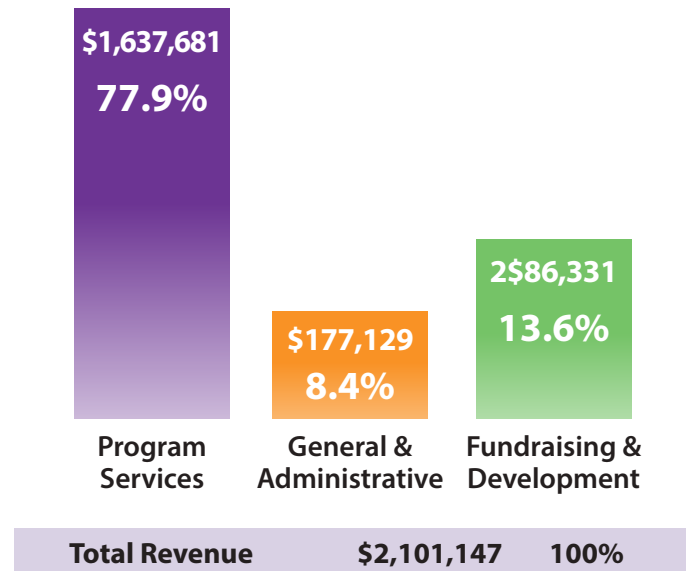
